COVID-19 Exposure Control, Mitigation, and Recovery: Expectations for groups using Suquamish UCC facilities and property

- 1. PPE Utilization:** All people must wear face coverings at all times, except one individual at a time may speak without a face covering.
- 2. Physical Distancing:** One household may sit as a group in indoor or outdoor gatherings, with a space of at least 6 feet between groups.
- 3. Hygiene and Sanitation:** Disinfectant wipes (provided by the group) will be readily available for all participants. For an indoor gathering, attendees will be encouraged to regularly wash their hands.


Before each speaker uses a microphone, it will be wiped with a disinfectant wipe.

Hard surfaces of all chairs provided for a gathering will be wiped with disinfectant wipes before and after the event.

- 4. Incident Reporting:** Any occurrence of COVID-19 infection in an attendee will be reported immediately to the Church office and Kitsap County.
- 5. Location Disinfection Procedures:** The building HVAC system provides adequate air exchange, filtration, and disinfection.

In outdoor gatherings, no walls will be erected that impede the free flow of air.

- 6. COVID-19 Safety Training:** Group leaders/facilitators will be cognizant of COVID-19 information and precautions on the Kitsap County website.

- 7. Exposure Response Procedures:** Names of attendees will be logged, including a phone number or other contact information for each attendee. The log will be retained by the group leader/facilitator, and will be made available to the Church office upon request.

Attendees will be asked to notify the group leader/facilitator if they develop symptoms of COVID-19 or test positive within two weeks after the gathering.

If an outbreak occurs, all attendees will be contacted. A formal review of the event will be conducted by the Church Council to identify factors that may have contributed to the outbreak. Steps will be taken to address these factors.
